Session 1: Inspiring Change Through Advocacy

Jayson Welter, General Counsel, kicked off the session outlining UnitedAg's advocacy strategy, emphasizing a selective approach to legislative support based on member priorities. Key focus areas include rural healthcare access, Medi-Cal payment rates, water, labor, wages (including PAGA), pesticides, and invasive species. At the federal level, UnitedAg monitors immigration and H-2A issues, leveraging partnerships with the National Council of Agricultural Employers and advocacy groups like the Agricultural Council of California.

The panel featured experts discussing agricultural advocacy strategies. Josh Walters explained how the Alliance of California Farmers and Ranchers supports moderate Democrats in key districts to advance agricultural interests. Louie Brown highlighted the importance of trust-based relationships with legislators. Assemblymember Alexandra Macedo shared insights on navigating Sacramento's political landscape to support agriculture.

Emmy-winning filmmaker Jeff Aiello stressed the need for agriculture to reshape its narrative through storytelling. Board Chair Eric Bream compared advocacy to protecting crops from frost—small changes can lead to significant impact.

A lively Q&A followed, with discussions continuing into the welcome reception, inspiring attendees to engage as advocates for agriculture.







President's Message

During her opening remarks, President & CEO Kirti Mutatkar shared insights from a recent visit to Rome, reflecting on how the city seamlessly blends ancient traditions with modern advancements. She drew a parallel between Rome's enduring spirit and UnitedAg's journey—where change is inevitable, but the core identity remains rooted in strong connections.

She referenced the Ship of Theseus thought experiment, which questions whether something remains the same if all its parts are replaced over time. In the same way, while aspects of UnitedAg may evolve—new faces, innovations, and strategies—its foundation remains unchanged: the relationships built with employees, service reps, board members, and members.

Kirti emphasized that innovation is key to longevity. Just as Rome thrived by embracing advancements like concrete and aqueducts, UnitedAg must continue to adapt and innovate to sustain its legacy for future generations.

Her message concluded with a call to action: **strengthen connections and embrace innovation to ensure UnitedAg's lasting impact.**

- Mindset & Learning: Staying adaptable and open to change proved crucial for maximizing the benefits of evolving ag tech.
- **Problem-Solving Approach:** Rather than chasing the latest tools, farmers and agribusinesses focused on solving core industry challenges.
- Al & Data Utilization: Al, while not perfect, enhanced decision-making and efficiency. Data-driven insights helped optimize farm management and sustainability efforts.
- Implementation & Motivation: Setting clear goals, tracking progress, and fostering innovation contributed to long-term success.

FINDING MORE HAPPINESS IN YOUR TIME

The luncheon keynote Cassie Holmes, award-winning researcher and author of Happier Hour, delivered an inspiring presentation on how to beat distractions, expand your time, and focus on what truly matters. She challenged the common belief that having more free time automatically leads to happiness, emphasizing instead that happiness comes from how we use our time, not how much of it we have. Key insights from presentation:


- Avoid "Time Poverty" The feeling of never having enough time can lead to stress and unhappiness.
- Quality Over Quantity Meaningful activities and connections matter more than just having more free time.
- The "Time Jar" Method Prioritize important activities first to ensure time is well spent.
- Turn Routines into Rituals Small, intentional changes can enhance joy and fulfillment.
- Protect Your Time Reduce distractions, commit to priorities, and appreciate the present moment.

Holmes' message was clear: Happiness doesn't come from having more time—it comes from making the most of the time we have. By making intentional choices, focusing on meaningful activities, and setting boundaries to protect our well-being, we can create a more fulfilling and balanced life.

Her insights resonated deeply with attendees, offering practical strategies for reducing stress, improving productivity, and finding joy in everyday moments.
